FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN HARRIS COUNTY AND VESTEDIN AGING CONSULTING GROUP, LLC

THE STATE OF TEXAS

COUNTY OF HARRIS §

This Amendment to the Agreement is made and entered into by and between Harris County (the "County"), a body corporate and politic under the laws of the State of Texas and acting by and through Harris County Public Health (the "Department"), and VESTEDin AGING Consulting Group, LLC ("Contractor") a corporation doing business under the laws of the State of Texas. County and Contractor are known individually as "Party" and collectively as "Parties."

Recitals

On May 7, 2024, the County entered into an agreement with Contractor to provide certain services for the Department (the "Master Agreement").

The County and Contractor now desire to amend the Master Agreement for the first time ("First Amendment") for the purpose of extending the term and adding additional funds to the Master Agreement.

The County and Contractor are adding additional funds for additional services as illustrated in the Harris County Contract Extension Request attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.

Contractor warrants and represents that it is willing and capable of providing the services.

Terms

1) CONTRACT CONSTRUCTION

This First Amendment shall be governed by the Master Agreement, which is incorporated by reference as though fully set forth word for word.

2) TERM

The term of the Master Agreement is hereby amended to extend until January 6, 2026.

3) LIMIT OF APPROPRIATION

Having previously certified funds in the amount of One Million Two Hundred Forty-Two Thousand Four Hundred Twenty and 00/100 (\$1,242,420.00), the County hereby amends the Master Agreement to certify as available Seventy Five Thousand and No/100 (\$75,000.00), in additional funds, bringing the total amount of funds certified as available under the Master Agreement to One Million Three Hundred Seventeen Thousand Four Hundred Twenty and No/100 (\$1,317,420.00). Contractor

understands and agrees, said understanding and agreement also being of the absolute essence of this contract, that the total maximum compensation that Contractor may become entitled to hereunder, and the total maximum sum that the County shall become liable to pay to Contractor under this First Amendment, shall not under any conditions, circumstances, or interpretations thereof exceed the sum of Seventy Five Thousand and No/100 (\$75,000.00).

Contractor understands and agrees, said understanding also being of the absolute essence of this contract, that the maximum amount Contractor may become entitled to under the Master Agreement shall be One Million Three Hundred Seventeen Thousand Four Hundred Twenty and No/100 (\$1,317,420.00). Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, or that may be construed to the contrary, the County's liability under the terms and provisions of this First Amendment is limited to said sum; and when all the funds so certified are expended, Contractor's sole and exclusive remedy shall be to terminate this First Amendment.

4) ORDER OF PRECEDENCE

In the event of any conflict between the terms and provisions of this First Amendment, or any portion thereof, and the terms and provisions of any other part or portion of the Master Agreement, this First Amendment shall control.

All other terms and provisions of the Master Agreement shall remain in full force and effect as originally written and subsequently amended.

5) EXECUTION, MULTIPLE COUNTERPARTS

VESTEDin, AGING Consulting Group, LLC

This First Amendment may be executed in several counterparts. Each counterpart is deemed an original. All counterparts together constitute one and the same instrument. Each Party warrants that the undersigned is a duly authorized representative with the power to execute this First Amendment.

Harris County Contract Extension Request

Program Extension: September 7, 2025 - January 6, 2026

Executive Summary

We request a four-month extension for the Harris County Public Health Capacity-Strengthening Program Cohort 1, with additional funding of **\$75,000**, to ensure optimal program completion and maximum impact for participating organizations. This extension addresses the <u>delayed start</u> of cohort members and allows for the comprehensive implementation of all planned capacity-strengthening activities.

Budget Request Breakdown

1. Core Program Expenses (\$62,000)

- Project Management & Evaluation: \$20,000 (\$5,000/month)
 - o Overall project coordination and oversight
 - o Collaboration with HCPH Evaluation team
 - o Data collection, analysis, and sense-making
 - Monthly reporting and impact documentation
 - Coach supervision and program quality assurance
- Capacity Coaches: \$32,000 (\$4,000/month per coach, two coaches)
 - o Continued 1:1 support for participating organizations
 - o Implementation assistance for capacity-strengthening plans
 - o Regular progress monitoring and adjustment
 - Documentation of organizational growth and challenges
- Portal Management & Operations: \$10,000 (\$2,500/month)
 - Learning management system maintenance
 - Resource library updates and curation
 - Technical support for participants
 - o Program documentation and record-keeping

2. Special Programming (\$13,000)

- Expert Speaker Series (2 speakers September and October 2024): \$10,000
 - Marketing/Branding Workshop
 - o Data-Driven Leadership
- Cohort Completion & Graduation: \$3,000
 - o Graduation certificates and frames
 - Printed impact reports
 - o Graduation ceremony materials
 - Recognition awards

Extension Justification

1. Program Integrity

- The delayed start has misaligned technical assistance support with nonprofit contract completion dates, creating a critical gap in our ability to assist them with implementing organizational changes
- The current contract timeline would leave participating organizations without VESTEDin's technical assistance during their final implementation phase
- Additional time ensures proper integration of learning and implementation of new strategies
- Allows for proper documentation of outcomes and impact measurement

2. Organizational Readiness

- Nonprofits need adequate time to implement new systems and processes
- Change management requires sustained support and guidance
- An extended timeline allows for proper testing and refinement of their new approaches

3. Maximum Impact

- Technical Assistance and Coaching support ensure the successful implementation of organizational changes
- Aligned contract timelines will maintain momentum and prevent disruption in capacity-building progress
- Proper graduation and celebration reinforces achievement and community building
- A complete program cycle allows for comprehensive evaluation and documentation of impact
