## FIRST AMENDMENT TO FARM PLOT LEASE AGREEMENT BETWEEN HARRIS COUNTY & SMALL PLACES, NONPROFIT CORPORATION

This First Amendment to the Farm Plot Lease Agreement is made and entered into by and between Harris County, a body corporate and politic under the laws of the State of Texas ("County" or "Landlord"), and Small Places, a Texas non-profit corporation, doing business as Finca Tres Robles ("Tenant"). County and Tenant are sometimes referred to herein individually or collectively as "Party" or "Parties".

## **RECITALS:**

WHEREAS, on August 23, 2022, the Commissioners Court approved a Farm Plot Lease Agreement between Landlord and Tenant on property located at 6000 Canal St., Houston, Texas 77011 (the "Lease");

WHEREAS, in 2023, the City of Houston replatted the property such that the address for the property was changed from 6000 Canal St., Houston, Texas 77011 to 5715 Canal St., Houston, Texas 77011.

WHEREAS, the Parties now desire to amend the Lease Agreement for the purposes of updating the address information;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, agreements and benefit to both Parties contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Lease is hereby amended and modified as follows:

## TERMS:

- 1. This First Amendment shall be governed by the Lease Agreement which is incorporated herein by reference as if set out word for word.
- 2. The Lease Agreement, including recitals, is hereby amended to remove any reference to 6000 Canal St., Houston, Texas 77011 and substitute in its place 5715 Canal St., Houston, Texas 77011.
- 3. All other terms and conditions of the Lease Agreement remain in full force and effect as originally written. It is expressly understood and agreed that the Lease Agreement is incorporated herein by reference. In the event of any conflict between the terms and provisions of this First Amendment, or any portion thereof, and the terms and provisions of any other part of the Lease Agreement, this First Amendment shall control.

4. Execution; Multiple Counterparts. This Amendment may be executed in several counterparts. Each counterpart is deemed an original. All counterparts together constitute one and the same instrument. Each Party warrants that the undersigned is a duly authorized representative with the power to execute this Amendment.
