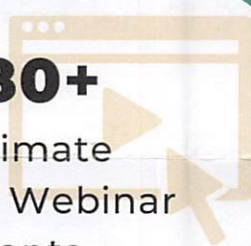

NACCHO has been honored to stand with you every step of the way. While you lead in your communities, NACCHO leads at the national level, keeping the needs of local health departments front and center in national policy conversations, connecting members to outside partners and stakeholders to share information, and building a community of support for all local health department leaders and staff to support each other during these challenging times.

2022 NACCHO Achievements for Local Public Health at the National Level

Public health workforce loan repayment passes Congress.

On December 29, 2022, President Joe Biden signed the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 (H.R. 2617), which included language authorizing the Public Health Workforce Loan Repayment Program, **one of NACCHO's top legislative priorities for years**. NACCHO advocated for the creation of this program beginning in 2020, recognizing workforce challenges that predated COVID-19 and then worsened during the pandemic response. Under the new law, the Public Health Workforce Loan Repayment Program will offer up to \$150,000 in loan repayment to public health professionals who have graduated within the past 10 years and agree to serve three years in a local, state, or tribal health department. The program will provide health departments with a new tool to recruit and retain top talent with a range of degrees vital to the needs of a 21st century public health workforce like public health, epidemiology, data systems, informatics, and statistics. NACCHO members were integral to garnering support for the Public Health Loan Repayment Program over the past several years, with hundreds of you engaging with your lawmakers to educate them about the challenges facing local public health and explaining how a loan repayment program would help.

Provide predictable, sustained, disease-agnostic funding to support core public health infrastructure.

\$200M appropriated in FY22 law.

Ensure public health funding reaches local health departments equitably and efficiently.

Directive language from Congress in FY22 appropriations regarding allocation of funds to local health departments.

We remain steadfast in our gratitude for your tireless engagement and appreciate the work you do to create healthier, more equitable communities. Remember, by renewing, **you and your department staff will continue to receive full member benefits**, including access to NACCHO's website, discounts, funding and training opportunities, technical assistance, collaboration with their public health peers, and eligibility to serve on national committees. 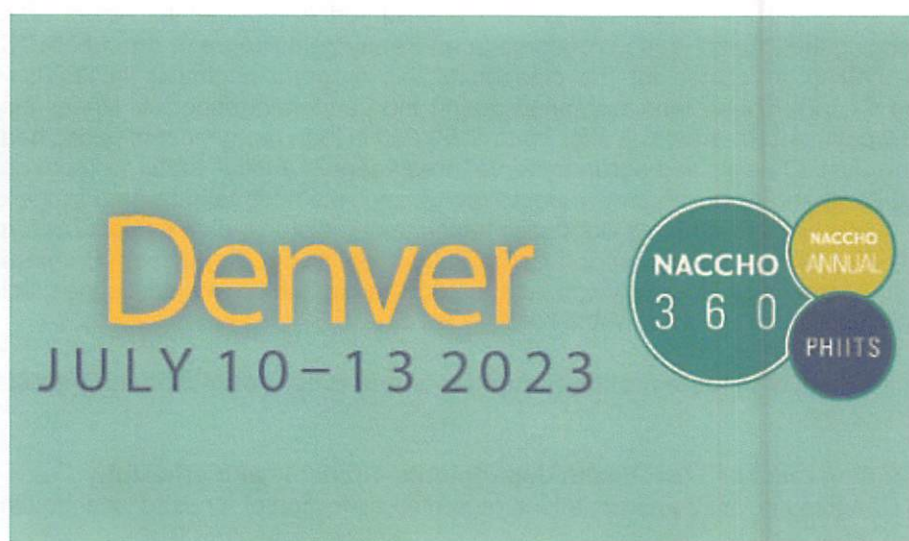
