The Harris County Sheriff's Office makes no claims; warranty expressed or implied, or promises as to the soundness, health, condition, or suitability of the equine.

I, <u>Houston Interactive Aquarium</u>, residing at <u>5440 N Sam Houston Pkwy E Houston</u>, Texas, have been granted, subject to my execution of this Release of Liability the privilege, at my request and personal benefit, to obtain a Harris County Sheriff's Office retired Police Equine.

I Amanda Conk, of Harris County, Texas do by these presents for myself, my heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns, hereby release and agree to INDEMNIFY,

HOLD AND SAVE HARMLESS Harris County, its officers, agents, and employees from any and all action, claims, demands, costs, or damages arising from or resulting from property damage, personal injuries or death sustained by me or my property while I have ownership of the retired police equine.

I further agree by these presents for myself, my heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns, to INDEMNIFY, HOLD AND SAVE HARMLESS Harris County, its agent's officers, and employees, from any liability, action, claim, damage, award, or judgment incurred or suffered by Harris County, or individuals as a result of any act or omission by me or caused by me while I have ownership of the retired equine.

represent that I am at least twenty-one (21) years of age and that I make this request, this waiver, and this promise of indemnity of my own free will and desire.

The Harris County Sheriff's Office agrees to transfer ownership of, and responsibility for, the equine to the adopter at a cost of \$0.00 to the adopter. The adopter agrees to accept ownership, responsibility, care, and control of the equine without cost to the Harris County Sheriff's Office. The adopter agrees to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The adopter agrees to waive and hold harmless the Harris County Sheriff's Office, its employees, agents, and officials from any claim of liability, injury, or damage arising from ownership of the equine.
- 2. The adopter agrees to provide a good and dignified retirement for the equine, including normal and reasonable care, grooming, feeding, and housing without cost to the Harris County sheriff's Office.
- 3. The adopter agrees that the equine will not be used or maintained under conditions amounting to cruelty as defined in Texas Statute Sec. 42.09., CRUELTY TO ANIMALS, or other provisions of law, or under conditions not conducive to the good health or condition of the equine.
- 4. The adopter agrees not to use, maintain, sell or transfer the equine for scientific, medical or veterinary, or other experimentation.
- The adopter agrees to provide reasonable and necessary veterinary care and treatment. Such treatment may include medically indicated euthanasia as directed by a licensed Doctor of Veterinary Medicine, or necessary under generally accepted emergency conditions.
- 6. The adopter agrees not to sell or transfer the equine unless the new owner agrees to abide by the above terms or conditions.

7. The adopter agrees not to use the equine for employment or compensation.

Mounted Patrol Mascot request

The Mounted Patrol Unit is requesting Chain of Command approval to seize a brown and white paint miniature pony which was estray. The pony would be used as a tool in the interaction with children and adults during school and barn visits.

On Wednesday, October 17th, 2018, Deputies responded to a request by the Houston Police Department (HPD) at 4700 Simsbrook. The call was in reference to a pony stuck in a storm drain. Upon arrival, deputies found the Houston Fire Department (HFD) was in the process of removing the pony from the drain. Upon extrication, livestock deputies took possession of the pony and transported him to the HCSO livestock facility.

The rescue and recovery of the pony received local media attention which has generated interest in his adoption.

Once approved:

- The pony will be seized and awarded to the Sheriff's Office
- Sponsorship for his care and maintenance will be sought
- Mounted patrol style equipment will be sought
