SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN HARRIS COUNTY AND CATHOLIC CHARITIES OF THE ARCHDIOCESE OF GALVESTON-HOUSTON

This Second Amendment to the Agreement is made by and between Harris County (the "County"), a body corporate and politic under the laws of the State of Texas, acting by and through the Harris County Budget Management Department (the "Department"), and Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston ("Catholic Charities" or "Contractor"), a non-profit 501(c)(3) corporation. The County and Contractor are referred to herein collectively as the "Parties" and individually as a "Party."

Recitals

On August 25, 2020, Commissioners Court approved the Agreement with Catholic Charities ("Master Agreement"), pursuant to Section 81.027 of the Texas Local Government Code, and 42 U.S.C. § 801, for the administration of the Harris County COVID-19 Emergency Direct Assistance Program ("EDAP") for the Department (the "Services").

On December 15, 2021, the Parties amended the Master Agreement for the first time ("First Amendment") to add additional funds to the Program Fund and to revise and clarify certain terms in the Master Agreement and the Scope of Services.

The Parties now desire to amend the contract a second time ("Second Amendment") to provide data to The Wilson Sheehan Lab for Economic Opportunities to understand the impact of financial assistance on the housing stability and financial stability of recipients.

Terms

Section I of the Second Amendment

This Second Amendment supplements and revises the Master Agreement and the First Amendment and shall be governed by the applicable terms and conditions of the Master Agreement and the First Amendment.

Section II of the First Amendment

Subsection N is added to Section I. of the Master Agreement entitled "General Scope of Services" is hereby added to read as follows:

N. Contractor will share and will allow its subcontractors to share the data collected

from fund applications with The Wilson Sheehan Lab for Economic Opportunities ("LEO") through The University of Notre Dame. There will be a separate agreement between LEO and the County on the terms and conditions of the data sharing. Incentives may be offered to those who complete the survey. If incentives are used, LEO will fund the incentives.

Section III of the Second Amendment

All unrevised terms of the Master Agreement and the First Amendment shall remain in full force and effect as originally written.

Section IV of the Second Amendment

It is expressly understood and agreed that the Master Agreement and the First Amendment are incorporated herein by reference. In the event of any conflict between the terms and provisions of this Second Amendment, or any portion thereof, and the terms and provisions of any other part or portion of the Master Agreement or the First Amendment, this Second Amendment shall control.

Section V of the Second Amendment

EXECUTION

Multiple Counterparts: This Second Amendment may be executed in several counterparts. Each counterpart is deemed an original. All counterparts together constitute one and the same instrument. Each Party warrants that the undersigned is a duly authorized representative with the power to execute this Second Amendment
