Harris County Infrastructure Project Texas 2017 Hurricane Harvey CDBG-DR Funding – Income Survey Certification (Harris County Engineering Department Street & Drainage Improvements)

June 8, 2021

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has allocated \$5.024 billion in Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funds to the state of Texas in response to Hurricane Harvey, DR-4332, through the publication of the Federal Register, Vol. 83, No. 28, Friday, February 9, 2018. This allocation was made available through the Continuing Appropriations Act, 2018 and Supplemental Appropriations for Disaster Relief Act, 2017 that allocated \$7.4 billion in CDBG-DR funds in response to major disasters declared in 2017. In their Action Plan submitted to HUD on May 8, 2018, the State of Texas, under their program administrator the Texas General Land Office (GLO), made a direct allocation of \$1,115,386,830 in Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funding to Harris County.

As a part of the Infrastructure/Non-housing CDBG-DR funding, Harris County, with approval of Commission's Court on February 11, 2020, submitted a Competitive for \$76,668,492 to the GLO. To access the infrastructure/non-housing funding allocated to Harris County, GLO required the submission of an Infrastructure Project Application which was approved by court on December 18, 2018 for the Harris County Engineering Department Street & Drainage Improvements (Carol and Plantation Drives) project in Precinct 2.

Harris County Engineering Department Street & Drainage Improvements project was identified by the GLO on April 7, 2021, as requiring an income survey of the project service area to confirm it will benefit a majority, 51 percent or greater, of low-to-moderate income persons. Income survey was performed in project's service area.

Harris County Engineering Department Street & Drainage Improvements income survey results were below the threshold of the 51 percent minimum of low-to-moderate income persons and instead must qualify using the urgent need benefit criteria for its service area. To accept the income survey results for the urgent need criteria, GLO requires the TXCDBG Survey Tabulation Form with results must be certified by the chief elected official of the jurisdiction and submitted to the GLO for their review.

It is recommended that Commissioners Court certify the income survey results for the 2017 Hurricane Harvey Texas CDBG-DR Round One Infrastructure Project, Harris County Engineering Department Street & Drainage Improvements, and approve its submission to the GLO.

WHEREAS, In the State of Texas Action Plan submitted to U.S. HUD on May 8, 2018 by the Texas General Land Office (GLO), the State made a direct allocation of \$1,115,386,830 in Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funding to Harris County; and

WHEREAS, The GLO on May 9, 2018 notified Harris County to complete a Supplemental Action Plan, for Hurricane Harvey Round 1 CDBG-DR funding, which will be amended into the State's Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with GLO requirements, on July 10, 2018 the Harris County Commissioner Court approved the Harris County Supplemental Action Plan and resolved to submit the plan to the GLO; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with GLO requirements, on October 23, 2018 the Harris County Commissioner Court approved the Harris County Method of Distribution (MOD) and GLO has approved the MOD; and

WHEREAS, on December 18, 2018 the Harris County Commissioners Court approved the Harris County 2017 CDBG-DR Round One Infrastructure Project Application No. 1, on March 12, 2019 it approved Infrastructure Project Application No. 2, on March 26, 2019 it approved Infrastructure Project Application No. 3, and on July 9, 2019 it approved Infrastructure Project Application No. 4; and

WHEREAS, to access the 2017 Hurricane Harvey CDBG-DR Round One Infrastructure funding allocated to the county, Harris County Community Services Department is seeking approval to submit an Infrastructure Project Application No. 5 to GLO detailing the following additional proposed infrastructure (non-housing) projects as described in the Harris County Supplemental Action Plan.

- Harris County Engineering Street and Drainage Improvements (Pct. 2)
- Precinct2gether, Inc./St. Paul's Episcopal Church of Houston-Health and Services Center (Pct. 2)

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF HARRIS COUNTY, TEXAS THAT:

Section I: The recitals set forth in this order are true and correct.

Harris County Infrastructure Project Application No. 5 for Texas 2017 Hurricane Harvey CDBG-DR Funding

February 11, 2020

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has allocated \$5.024 billion in Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funds to the state of Texas in response to Hurricane Harvey, DR-4332, through the publication of the Federal Register, Vol. 83, No. 28, Friday, February 9, 2018. This allocation was made available through the Continuing Appropriations Act, 2018 and Supplemental Appropriations for Disaster Relief Act, 2017 that allocated \$7.4 billion in CDBG-DR funds in response to major disasters declared in 2017. In their Action Plan submitted to HUD on May 8, 2018, the State of Texas, under their program administrator the Texas General Land Office (GLO), made a direct allocation of \$1,234,813,590 in Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funding to Harris County.

The Federal Register and the State's Action Plan set the requirement that 79 percent (\$881,155,596) will support housing activities and 21 percent (\$234,231,234) will support infrastructure/non-housing activities. It should be noted that all allocations of CDBG-DR must meet the 70% low-to-moderate income benefit requirement. On July 10, 2018, Commissioners Court approved the Harris County Supplemental Action Plan that provides the description of housing and non-housing/infrastructure programs to be undertaken with the CDBG-DR funding.

Refer to the attached Table 2: 2017 CDBG-DR Infrastructure Application Log for previously approved applications, amounts and date of court approval. With this fifth Infrastructure/non-housing application Harris County allocates an additional \$2,672,513 of the separate \$76,668,492 for competitive request for proposals for the following projects. The remaining competitive allocation amount will be allocated as those projects are developed.

In accordance with HUD and GLO citizen participation requirements, on February 4, 2020 the Harris County Community Services Department (HCCSD) published the Infrastructure Project Application No. 5 (Application) for Hurricane Harvey 2017 Community Development Block Grant—Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) Round One Funding for the required 30-day public comment period. The application can be found on the HCCSD's website at https://csd.harriscountytx.gov/Pages/DisasterRecovery.aspx. A public hearing will be held at HCCSD offices on Monday, February 17, 2020 at 5:30 pm to accept questions and comments. The public comment period will close on March 4, 2020.

It is recommended that Commissioners Court approve and resolve to submit the 2017 Hurricane Harvey CDBG-DR Harris County Infrastructure Project Application No. 5 to the GLO.
