
Justice backlog update

Criminal Courts: Backlog progress using key indicators



Key Takeaways

There is improvement in the clearing out of the backlog relative to several months ago. Two datapoints suggest this:

- Number of cases in backlog has flatlined from January through August for Felony cases. Misdemeanor has ranged between 22K – 23K since mid-last year
- The % of backlog cases disposed is back up to/greater than prepandemic levels

Another measure to keep an eye on is the jail population – a growing population may indicate that we're falling behind in processing serious cases

Note: Number of cases in backlog calculated as cases older than 360 days for felonies and 180 days for Misdemeanor; Number of backlog cases disposed is cases disposed that are over 360 days for felonies and 180 days for misdemeanor; Number of jailed defendants is an average for the month, for September it is for the first two days- this includes both pre-trial and disposed cases and is primarily Felony cases. 

Jury operations underway; kick-off and results for other projects awaited



Expanded jury operations kicked off on 2nd of August with the addition of 3 additional juries per day (75% increase in juries). Some key takeaways from the limited data we have are:

- Utilization rates (defined as juries filled/juries available) have dropped to 35% In absolute numbers average panels filled per week are 12, similar to May
- Older/backlogged cases disposed by Courts is up ~18% in Felonies but down ~16% in the Misdemeanor Courts from July to August
- One caveat on August numbers is that they may not be representative since the last day to pick a panel for August was June 30th, 2021 which was prior to the approval for expansion of juries

Sheriff's Office Evidence

Sheriff's office is looking at candidates for the open positions. They expect bringing staff on board within the next week or so

Emergency Dockets

The first set of trials for Felony Courts are scheduled for 09/21/2021. Misdemeanor Courts are tentatively scheduled to kick off operations as early as 11/06/2021..

482nd District Court

New District Court was added and commenced operations on 9/1/2021. Judge Susan Brown is currently acting as visiting judge, as well as appointing others on a rotational basis, while we wait for the formal appointment from the Governor

Public Defender

Interviewing for positions has begun with the all efforts being made to add PDs as soon as possible
