Request Summary (Agenda Caption):

Request for approval of an award on the basis of low bid to P-Ville, Inc. in the amount of \$714,285 for mowing and various maintenance services for the west region for the Flood Control District for the period of January 1, 2022 - December 31, 2022 with four one-year renewal options, subject to applicable bonds to be received (210313).

Background and Discussion:

Full-Service Contracts are utilized to maintain the 18,000+ acres of vegetation throughout the county. All nine (9) sectors now utilize a full-service contract. Full-service contracts are structured so needed maintenance such as debris removal, buy-out lot mowing, and fence line pruning, are incorporated into a single contract. This inclusion of services has helped the District and its contractors provide a year-round presence and a reduction of deferring maintenance activities that cost less when performed more frequently.

Expected Impact:

Awarding this contract will allow the District to provide the citizens that live within this sector a level of service they have come to expect. These services include mowing channels and basins three times per year, monthly mowing of buy-out lots, debris removal as needed, and clearing fence lines along access points and adjacent to the channels.

Alternative Options:

Awarding a contract that provides fewer services or a reduced level of services. Performing some of the services with in-house forces.
