Subject: Interlocal Mowing Reimbursement Agreement with Terranova West Municipal Utility District

Purpose and Request:

Recommendation for authorization to execute an interlocal mowing reimbursement agreement with Terranova West Municipal Utility District for mowing of HCFCD Unit K531-01-00 for a term of five mowing seasons. Funds are available in the amount of \$3,337 for five mowing seasons. (Cypress Creek Watershed, Project ID K531-01-00-V004, Agreement No. 1417, Precinct 4).

Background and Discussion:

The Flood Control District mows three times per year. From time to time, other agencies, such as municipal utility districts, would like to mow areas that the Flood Control District mows more frequently. The Flood Control District uses these types of agreements to commit the local agency to maintaining the channel and/or basin and agrees to pay the local agency the amount of funding the Flood Control District would have paid to mow the areas.

Fiscal Impact: Funding of \$3,337 is available as part of the Districts Operations and Maintenance Budget.
